



Basic Coastal Navigation

Knowing how to safely get from here to there is an essential ingredient for enjoyable boating. While many have GPS in their cars to tell them which roads to take, those on the water need to really know how to navigate. There are no roads.

This four-hour seminar provides you with the essential skills in order to effectively navigate around the Cape or any coastal area. It covers the use of GPS in conjunction with your other navigation tools to plan and navigate a safe route to your destination. You will learn about waypoints, routes, and what to look out for.

You'll learn how to navigate your planned route with ease adding confidence and enjoyment to your cruise. And you will learn how to simply check to make sure you are where you think you are.

You'll also learn about the effects of tides and currents and how to deal with them.

The program includes hands-on exercises in planning and plotting on a full-sized chart of our area which is yours to keep. We will provide plotting tools for your use, or bring your own. You will get to ask questions and interact with the folks who wrote the book on navigation.

Your lead instructor is Bob Sweet, author of "The Weekend Navigator" and "GPS for Mariners." According to Bob, "we have taken the essence of our USPS Piloting and Advanced Piloting courses which take about 40 hours and distilled it down into a 4-hour program of what you really need to know." This program is great for new boaters and those with experience. You will learn a lot. It's also a good program which will get your spouse or mate engaged in navigation.

The cost of the seminar is \$35 for members and \$45 for non-members. It will be held at the Mashpee Public Library on Saturday, May 20th from 10am to 3pm with a lunch break.

Everything YOU NEED to know for this boating season

This is an eight- hour seminar with the perfect combination of classroom training and hands-on On-The-Water-Training.

Learn How to Handle a Boat like a Pro

BBSPS offers an array of training in boat handling. Our classroom program explains how a boat behaves in the water, and how it responds to your controls. You'll also learn techniques for effective close quarters maneuvering and docking, and how to deal with seas in open water.

This seminar has been presented by Bob Sweet at a wide range of boating events including TrawlerFest, the International Cruising Boat Expo, and the Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show, often in conjunction with on water training.

This classroom program is offered three times this Spring. First, it is the subject of the first two seminars in our Seamanship Series on Tuesday and Thursday March 28 and 30th at the Falmouth Public Library from 6:30 to 8:30 pm. The first session is free for all to attend. The second is \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members.

The second time, it is offered on Saturday, April 20th at the Mashpee Public Library from 10am to 2pm with a lunch break. The cost of this program is \$35 for members and \$45 for non-members.

The third time, it is offered in conjunction with our annual On-the-Water training program on June 16th from 6:30-9:30 pm at Parker's Boat Yard in Cataumet. This also serves as the classroom pre-training for those going out on the water on the following day. Those attending just the seminar can do so at a cost of \$35 for members and \$45 for non-members.

The second element in our boat handling program is the USPS simulator. This computer-based simulator lets you practice the same maneuvers that you would do with our on-water program using a very realistic simulator on a Boston Whaler 20 foot boat. This simulator was developed for USPS with funding from the U.S. Coast Guard. You can dock, depart, run a slalom and a host of other maneuvers. This simulator will be available for about 2 weeks in mid-June. Stay tuned for details. The simulator is free.

The third element in our boat handling program is going out on the water to actually do the maneuvers we train for and gain hands-on experience with two licensed Captains, Dick Moore and Frank Lingard. This will be on Saturday, June 17th at Parker's Boat Yard. Cost for members is \$100 which includes the Friday seminar. Non-members pay \$150.

There are very few ways to get quality boat handling training and our squadron has the best. These programs are geared for the new boater as well as the experienced old salt. Most of the latter learned by trial and error, and most of those who have taken the program have remarked how much more they learned that will really help them. Newer boaters learn how to do things the right way from the outset saving a lot of potential mistakes. Knowing how to handle a boat properly adds to the enjoyment of boating while reducing the stress.

They range from Coast Guard licensed captains with extensive offshore and cruising experience to a published author of numerous books covering boat handling, marine electronics and navigation.

The success of our educational program depends upon you, our members and the general public participating in our courses. This year is the time to sign up for one of our courses or to volunteer a few hours of your time to assist our instructors and maybe share some of your experiences with our students.

An aggressive marketing campaign is now underway to promote the educational program and it will include promotions at local boat shows, advertising with local boat dealers, newspaper articles, public service announcements and most importantly, the posting of informational flyers throughout our local towns and their business establishments. And we need your help in spreading the word!

As you read *THE LOG*, you will find a professionally printed "flyer" advertising our spring program. 
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

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
