America's Boating Course (ABC) is recognized as one of the very best ways to prepare people for boating.

ABC meets NASBLA certification requirements, is recognized by the U.S. Coast Guard, and **meets MA requirements for boat operation by 12-15 year old boaters.**

ABC covers the basics of operating a boat safely, including rules of the road, aids to navigation, required equipment, and boat handling techniques.

Each class is a live, interactive, virtual presentation on 4 weekday evenings followed by a "drive in" in-person, proctored exam given the Sunday following the last class.

Engine Maintenance is a 10-chapter course that stresses the diagnosis of modern systems, while also teaching the basics of engine layout and operation, and covers those repairs a person can still reasonably perform. Gasoline inboards, outboards, and diesel engines are taught in a way that reinforces the common aspects of how engines work and also covers basic mechanical systems such as drive systems, steering systems, and engine controls.

ABC classes

This is not a live presentation and has no proctored exam, hence it is not approved by MA, but it does present the same material.

Boat Handling (Seamanship)

One student took the Boat Handling exam and it has been sent to USPS for grading. Boat Handling is the first of the USPS advanced grades courses and should be completed either before or just after the Piloting course in order to receive USPS credit for both.

Marine Electrical Systems

The "drive in" exam for the Marine Electrical Systems course will be held Sunday December 5. This is the first of three USPS courses on boat electrical and electronic systems and covers the wiring of your boat and its systems. We will present this course again starting March 15, just in time for Spring outfitting!

BBSPS education programs will begin in January 2022 when we will begin our Winter program offerings. These will include Engine Maintenance, Weather, and Coastal Navigation courses. We will offer ABC programs and our seminar series beginning in March 2022.

It is a challenging time for presentation of education programs but BBSPS has risen to the occasion and transitioned our offerings to an on line format. Our 2022 offerings are all planned using a live "virtual" presentation followed by individual in depth sessions with each student as necessary. We are striving to bring our members and the boating public high quality, comprehensive, boating education opportunities. More ways to get AIS

Bob Sweet

Following up on last month's article on AIS (which stands for Automated Identification System), there are some new ways to get you tuned-in. Again, I will say that you should seriously consider getting access to AIS, here are a couple of new options.

First of all, handheld VHF radios are a new battleground for neat new stuff. Even if you have a fixed-mount VHF radio, it makes sense to have a handheld. It offers communication while you are in your dinghy on the way to and from the boat. Then it becomes your backup if and when needed. More and more handheld radios are adding DSC capability. To do that, they need to incorporate a GPS receiver for position information. DSC gives you the "Red" door for distress and enables direct signaling for calling.

Back to AIS, ICOM has added it to a handheld radio. Several manufacturers offer an AIS receiver in their fixed-mount units, but ICOM has taken it a step farther. This new handheld, which is available for about \$300, includes an AIS receiver in addition to GPS. The unit serves as a backup navigation and safety device. This becomes perhaps the least-cost approach to adding AIS on board. You will get alerts regarding any AIS transponder-equipped vessel that may get too close to you.

This handheld also doubles as a navigation tool and can help you navigate to selected waypoints. While it is not a chartplotter, it does function as a handheld GPS and can be a backup if needed.

On the fixed-mount side, Vesper Marine has been a leader in AIS. They have developed a high-end system called Cortex. This system includes a fully-capable AIS transponder incorporated into a DSC VHF radio with wi-fi. The handset display unit is available wired or wireless. It offers collision avoidance, VHF radio, anchor watch, instrument display, and plotter. Since the fixed-mounted processor is connected via NMEA2000 to all of your other electronics, the wireless remote has access to all of your equipment. Only one antenna is required. Now you can be seen as well as listening for other boats. And, you can automatically contact any vessel on the AIS screen using their MMSI and your radio. All of this does come at a price, about \$1800 for the processor and wireless handset.

The marine electronics market is highly competitive. You can expect others to offer similar products and inevitably prices will come down a bit. That said, a \$300 investment in the new ICOM handheld radio is almost a no-brainer! Stay safe, and enjoy.

USPS / BBSPS EDUCATION PROGRAM
(part 1 of 2)

USPS / BBSPS has an outstanding education program for boaters which takes them from a basic boating class through in-depth courses on specific boating topics leading them to competence and confidence. This program is divided into 4 major parts: ABC basic boating class; Seminars on specific boating topics; Advanced Grade full length courses on seamanship and navigation; and Elective full length courses on key boating subjects.

Let's explore the basic boating class and the advanced full-length courses.

America's Boating Course (ABC) is broad based survey course on basic boating information. It is designed to acquaint a new boater with core boating topics and introduce them to boat operation. This course is NASBLA approved and meets state requirements for issuance of a state boating safety certificate. The basic boating knowledge topics covered include: introduction to boats and boating; boating laws; boat safety equipment; safe boating practices; US aids to navigation; boating problems and how to deal with them; and water sports. Even if you have some boating experience this is an excellent course because it will help organize the major boating topics in your mind and not only teach you new things but help you discover what you do not know or need more help with.

The **Advanced Grade** courses are presented in a sequence and USPS assigns each member a "grade", reflecting their level of boating knowledge, based on how many of these courses they have completed. The course sequence is: Boat Handling; Coastal Navigation (Piloting); Advanced Coastal Navigation (Advanced Piloting); Offshore Navigation (Junior Navigation); and Celestial Navigation (Navigation).

Boat Handling (*Seamanship*) has six sections: rules of the road; docking and undocking, slow speed maneuvering; handling your boat underway; anchoring with assurance; emergencies on board; and knots and line handling. If you boat around Cape Cod and the islands these are all topics you need to know in detail. If you completed the ABC class, Boat Handling is the next logical step to give you more in depth knowledge of key seamanship topics.

Coastal Navigation (*Piloting*) "...is the first course in the sequence of USPS courses on navigation. This course focuses on navigation as it is done on recreational boats today and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool while covering enough of traditional techniques so the student will be able to find their way even if the GPS fails." The skills taught in Coastal Navigation are ones you need to safely navigate the Cape Cod waters.

Advanced Coastal Navigation (*Advanced Piloting*) "...is the second in the sequence of USPS courses on navigation. It continues to build coastal and inland navigation skills, allowing the student to take on more challenging conditions – unfamiliar waters, limited visibility, and extended cruises. GPS is embraced as a primary navigation tool while adding radar, chartplotters, and other electronic navigation tools." BBSPS teaches Coastal Navigation and Advanced Coastal Navigation in one continuous sequence. Completion of this sequence gives you knowledge and practice in the skills you will use to navigate our local area safely and with confidence.

Offshore Navigation is the first in a two-part program of study, followed by the Celestial Navigation course. In Offshore Navigation the student will continue to use GPS as the primary position sensor. Since visible terrestrial landmarks are no longer available to the navigator as reference points, the student will learn to substitute celestial objects such as the sun as a reference. The course begins by learning to take sights on the sun using a marine sextant and derive a line of position from that observation. Once the student has learned the basics of celestial sight reduction, the course continues with positioning in the offshore environment using both electronic and celestial tools. Offshore Navigation uses the skills learned in the Coastal Navigation courses and gives additional practice in applying them. The difference is simply what you use as an external reference to establish a position.

Celestial Navigation is the second part of the study of offshore navigation and further develops the student's understanding of celestial navigation. The course deals with learning celestial positioning using other bodies in addition to the sun and also deals with software tools that can be used to plan and execute an offshore voyage. All the navigation courses are sequential and each uses the skills learned in the previous classes which gives additional practice and competence. Even if you are not planning an offshore passage it is valuable to take the offshore courses to gain additional competence in traditional navigation skills.

Competence is gained through practice and with it comes confidence. The more you know, the better the boating experience gets. Next month we'll look at the Seminars and Elective full-length courses.

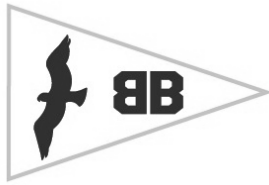

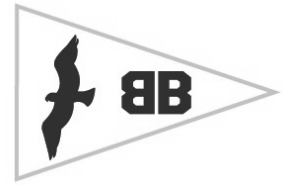
