Many states and adult education programs have become concerned with the quality of instruction being given to the public, especially in the area of boating safety. They are now requiring that anyone who teaches the public be able to show evidence that they have successfully completed an instructor training program.

The instructor development course focuses on how to teach adults using a modern, interactive and fun approach to learning. Students who complete the course will become certified USPS instructors already prepared to teach USPS boating classes. The USPS instructor certification will be valid for four years. Certification may be renewed for additional four year terms by attending a recertification seminar.

This program is also a great way to improve your skills and confidence in public speaking.

EDUCATION REPORT DECEMBER 2021

ABC classes

Our first ABC class will be in March 2022. We will offer a total of 8 ABC classes, one per month through October 2022.

If someone wants to take an ABC class but is not concerned about issuance of a MA boating safety certificate, which is only presently required for students 12-15 years old, they may take the USPS ABC II class on line through the USPS website. This is not a live presentation and has no proctored exam, hence it is not approved by MA, but it does present the same material.

Seminars Bob Sweet Dick Moore

Bob Sweet will present a special FREE seminar "What's Up with Charts....Big Changes are Coming" on January 12. The proposed changes are a BIG DEAL and we need to know what NOAA has planned and how we can influence what we will be able to have for charts in the future.

Our 2022 Seminar Series will begin on March 7. As we did in 2021 these will all be presented using a live virtual format which allows for the participants to ask questions and discuss the topics with the presenters. Join us!! The great thing about seminars is that you learn a lot and there is no homework or exam!!

Boat Handling (Seamanship) Dick Moore

CONGRATULATIONS to Rooster Fricke who passed the Boat Handling course.

Marine Electrical Systems Dick Moore

CONGRATULATIONS to Steve Abdow, Michael Casso, Joseph Franolich, and John Lansing who passed the Marine Electrical Systems Course.

This is the first of three USPS courses on boat electrical and electronic systems and covers the wiring of your boat and its systems. We will present this course again starting March 15, just in time for Sring outfitting!

Engine Maintenance 10 students Dick Moore

This is a 10 chapter course that covers gasoline inboards, outboards, and diesel engines in a way that reinforces the common aspects of how engines work and also covers basic mechanical systems such as drives, steering, and engine controls.

Weather 6 students Dick Moore

This course focuses on how weather systems form, behave, move, and interact with one another. This is a general weather course benefitting those sitting in their living room as much as those standing behind the helm.

Coastal Navigation (P + AP) 4 students Bob Sweet / Dick Moore

We've combined the two USPS courses Piloting and Advanced Piloting into one complete Coastal Navigation program. You learn how to effectively use charts, GPS, and a chartplotter to safely plan and navigate, how to check your navigation, and what to do if there is a problem.

Instructor Development 5 students Dick Moore / Bob Sweet

This course focuses on how to teach adults using a modern, interactive and fun approach to learning. Students who complete the course will become certified USPS instructors prepared to teach USPS boating classes.

Our 2022 offerings are all planned using a live "virtual" presentation followed by individual in depth sessions with each student as necessary. We are striving to bring our members and the boating public high quality, comprehensive, boating education opportunities. Look at our schedule of classes and seminars and join us...learn something.....have fun..... and have some person to person interaction, even though in a virtual format.

Back to Basics

Bob Sweet

We all use electronics on board. GPS and chartplotters have had a profound effect on how we navigate today – and they help keep us safer. They even help plot our courses avoiding shallows and obstacles with automatic route planning. AIS and radar show us what is around us on the surface and tell us if someone is going to come too close. However, most boaters don't truly know how to use all of this neat stuff!

Not only that, electronics and the marine environment are mortal enemies. Especially on salt water. Salt loves to corrode electronic circuit boards. Those who use tablets and phones in lieu of marine electronics are taking a real risk as these devices are not immune to damage. Sealed units designed for the marine environment are better, but even these don't last as long as similar electronics at home. The net result, overreliance on the electronics, could get you in trouble.

Finally, we have obsolescence. The technology changes so fast that adding a new piece of electronics on your boat may result in it not communicating with what you currently have on board. When something fails, you may need to replace a whole suite of eauipment.

So, while we truly count on these electronics, we still need to know the basics of navigation. As a rule of thumb, you should be able to put your finger on your present position on a chart within 10 seconds at any time you are afloat. That says two things, "one, you have the presence to know where you are, and two, you have a chart to put your finger on."

USPS has two coastal navigation courses that teach you the basics and how to apply that to using your electronics. As boaters, we do not have roads to follow. It is up to us, so we truly need to navigate. It just makes sense to have the background to handle your boat and do it confidently. You will also realize that you need to rely on some non-electronic tools such as your compass, your eyes and ears.

Your source of information to keep you safe from obstacles is charts. It is essential that you truly understand what charts are telling you. Correlating what you see with your eyes, and radar with the chart is essential to knowing where you are. Visual bearings are a key element of safe navigation.

To fully enjoy your time on the water, I recommend that you and your family all partake in our navigation courses and seminars, and practice on the water. Winter is a good time to do that.




