


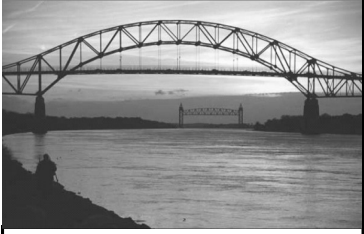

This course focuses on how to teach adults using a modern, interactive and fun approach to learning. Students who complete the course will become certified USPS instructors prepared to teach USPS boating classes.

# Exotic cars go up in flames on boat

It's one thing to have the money to burn on a luxury car, but quite another to have your new toy go up in flames. On a ship off the Azores.

That's the predicament many auto buyers and dealers find themselves in as they follow the saga of the Felicity Ace, a 650-foot cargo ship loaded with 3,965 vehicles that caught fire Wednesday on its way to the Port of Davisville in North Kingstown, R.I. Crew members were rescued after the blaze of unknown origin broke out, but the fate of the cars — including Audis, Lamborghinis, Porsches, and nearly 200 Bentleys, according to the shipping company — remains unknown.

MOL Ship Management, the operator of the Felicity Ace, said Friday that salvage teams were on their way to assess damage to the vessel and its cargo.

According to multiple reports, the cargo ship sunk near the Azores Islands about 9 am local time on Tuesday, March 1. This was officially announced by the Portuguese navy via its Facebook page. The vessel lost stability in waters where the depth is approximately 3,000 meters or over 9,800 feet. The area is an archipelago with many coral reefs, seamounts, tuna, dolphins, sharks, humpback whales, and other wildlife. All this unfolded after an operation to tow the boat by a salvage crew began on February 24.



Somehow, all 22 people onboard the Felicity Ace made it off the cargo ship without sustaining any injuries. It's still unknown what started the fire, but we do know the lithium-ion batteries kept it burning nice and super-hot since it started on February 16. The total loss of the ship and its contents is estimated at about \$438 million. What's more, at a time when there's a serious car shortage thanks to a lack of semiconductor chips and other components, this will only stress the market further.

If you come across a particular type of yellow plastic tubing on Cape Cod while you're out on the beach this summer, the Army Corps of Engineers asks that you report it.

The stringy plastic is called shock tubing, the Army Corps of Engineers explained in a news release. It was used to transmit a charge to underwater explosives during a Boston Harbor dredging project that ran from June 2021 to January 2022.

***The Cape Cod Times*** reported that the tubing has been showing up on Cape Cod's shores and other nearby beaches since the project started last summer.

It also wrote that volunteers cleaning up the beaches have removed 2,000 feet of the tubing.

## What's New in Marine Electronics

### Bob Sweet

The companies that produce marine electronics are all vying for your business. They come out with really neat stuff, and some that will cost a "boat load" of money. The whole idea from our perspective is to keep you safe on the water while you get to enjoy the boating experience with friends and family. Here are some things emerging from their drawing boards.

Chartplotters, now mostly called "multifunction displays," today are really computers with marinized packaging and bright displays. Thus, they are programmable, at least by their manufacturers. That means they obsolete a little more slowly, since the manufacturer can provide you with updates. That means the manufacturers need to come up with interesting accessories to keep the income flowing.

The major new changes in chartplotters come in the form of graphical user interface menus. In English, that means identifiable icons on the screen to help you find what you want. Raymarine has been one of the leaders with their Lighthouse operating system on their Axiom plotters. Everyone else now offers something similar. That's a good thing.

After a chartplotter, the most important addition is a VHF radio. While you are at it, you need to consider AIS. The Automatic Identification System is becoming an essential tool for all boaters. Commercial, and many recreational, vessels carry an AIS transponder. This serves as a beacon transmitting their identify, position, course, speed, and more. If you have a transponder, you also get to "see" other boats with transponders on your chartplotter and radar. If you don't want to spring for a transponder (around \$1,000), you should at least have an AIS receiver. Back to VHF radio, today you can buy a radio that also receives AIS information. They provide alerts should another vessel represent a collision risk. AIS is also being used to show navigation aids, some are virtual, so no AIS you can't see them.

Radar around the Cape Cod area is quite valuable. We have fog and traveling at night is an experience that radar helps. The latest is solid-state (low power) pulse compression radar. This really neat technology even detects whether something is getting closer or receding from you and changes the color on the screen. This is called doppler processing. If you are in the market for radar, check it out.

The other area getting a lot of attention is cameras. To be safe on the water, you need a head on a swivel to see in all directions. Cameras help. In addition, docking can be a challenge, but properly placed cameras can help. Your chartplotter probably can show video, so all you need is marinized cameras.

Raymarine took the camera idea a step further by adding image stabilization and the ability to overlay AIS data, waypoints, and navigation aids on the screen presentation so you know exactly what you are looking at. Garmin has the most inventive use of cameras. By placing 6 cameras around the boat with a processing box, they can create a top-down view of the boat and its surroundings - great for docking, but a little pricey. All of this will get better and less expensive as competition keeps them on their toes. Enjoy!

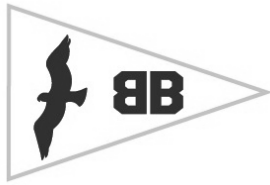

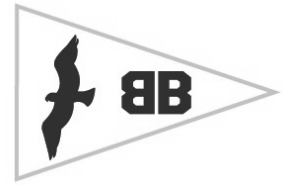
