AMERICA'S BOATING COURSE 2023 SCHEDULE

America's Boating Course (ABC) is recognized as one of the very best ways to prepare yourself for boating.

ABC meets NASBLA certification requirements, is recognized by the U.S. Coast Guard, and meets MA requirements for boat operation by 12-15 year-old boaters.

ABC covers the basics of operating a boat safely, including rules of the road, aids to navigation, required equipment, and boat handling techniques.

Each class is a live, interactive, virtual presentation using ZOOM on 4 weekday evenings followed by a "drive in" in-person, proctored exam given the Sunday morning following the last class.

It really is Spring! We are now well into our Spring educational program, having finished the first session of ABC and continuing Piloting and Marine Electronics courses. April will be another busy month with the second session of virtual ABC and some more seminars.

We attended the Spring D34 Conference in New Bedford. Our commander, John Rossi, was sworn in as the district Executive Officer as well. Later this month on April 29th we have our annual Change of Watch dinner with a very special speaker, Michael Tougias. Michael is the author of over 30 books. He'll talk about his latest, *Extreme Survival*.

Dick Moore and I are leading an effort to prepare a number of members across the district to implement **Jump Start**. This is a program that shows boaters how to handle their boats on the water. First, boaters attend a seminar to prepare them with understanding how the boat behaves and how to control it. Then, they get to go out with one of us to support them doing it on the water in their boat. This is a USPS program that provides insurance coverage for the training.

We're also offering a two Tuesday evening seminar on **Basic Coastal Navigation** on April 18 and 25. And, we will be offering ABC in May, June, and September as well.

This is the time of year that everyone gets their boats ready for the water. Remember to ask for a Vessel Safety Check – it's free! Contact John Rossi to schedule.

By all means, join us for our dinner social at the Sagamore Inn – it's a great venue, and sign up for some of our seminars. Here's to a fine Spring and good boating season!

Checking the Gear on your Boat

While you are cleaning the boat and tuning the engine, don't forget to check out your electronics and navigation equipment as well. Also, make sure your life jackets are in good shape in addition to flares, lights, and horns. If you don't have one, I recommend you acquire a hand bearing compass for checking bearings, a handheld GPS and VHF radio as backup. These are relatively inexpensive tools that add safety and redundancy to your boat. If you are a member of Freedom Boat Club or rent your boat, you should take these items along with you.

While we're talking about new gear, consider acquiring an AIS receiver. AIS stands for Automatic Identification System. Commercial vessels are required to use an AIS transceiver which continually transmits their location, course, and speed. With an AIS receiver you will know who and where they are and get alerts if they may be coming too close to you. Even more important, the Coast Guard is implementing virtual buoys which show up on charts and your AIS, but are not physically there. That's a lot less expensive than maintaining physical buoys, so you can expect more of them. Also, other navigation and safety related information will be transmitted via AIS. You will only receive this if you add AIS to your inventory of equipment. The best deal for adding AIS is to buy a VHF radio with AIS built-in.

A suggestion, if you are looking to get a handheld GPS and radio, consider an ICOM M94D. This \$350 handheld includes a radio with DSC for rescue, GPS for navigation, and AIS receiver to monitor other boats and navigation aids.

Also, don't forget your compass. It is really your basic navigation instrument. If it has a bubble, get it serviced or replace it. Also, consider checking how accurately it points in at least four cardinal directions. Turn your various electronics on and off and see if they have any effect on the compass pointing direction. If you adjust the compass, do so with your electronics on. There is a chapter in my book explaining how to adjust your compass using your GPS.

Check your chartplotter and make sure it is operating properly. It should accurately identify your position. Review the waypoints you have stored and make sure they are current. It's a good idea to have an alternate resource for reviewing waypoints, and routes. For example, you can export a "GPX" file from your chartplotter and review them on your tablet or computer. Navionics offers an annual subscription for US and Canadian charts on their app for \$25. You can create waypoints and routes on the app and export them via GPX file to your chartplotter, or visa versa using an MicroSD card. The app regularly updates the charts so you will have the most recent data to work with. The Navionics app also shows details of many lakes. An alternative for a computer is Open CPN. This is an open-source freeware program for PC's or MAC's that you can use to download free charts from NOAA to plan your waypoints and routes and export them to your chartplotter.

Check your radio. The best way, after the boat is launched is to use a working channel and communicate with a friend to make sure you are both transmitting and receiving. Also, make sure your DSC-equipped radio is connected to your GPS. And, make sure you have registered your vessel and have entered the resulting MMSI number into your radio. These are essential if you issue an emergency call, so the Coast Guard knows who you are and where. Do you have radar? If not, this is something you should consider adding to your boat. Using radar takes some practice. It is most useful for detecting nearby boats that could be a concern. The new solid-state chirp pulse radars are excellent and most of them add a Doppler feature that changes the color of targets that are getting closer. This makes identifying potential threats a snap. They also transmit much lower power pulses that removes any concern about radiation. Radar also helps detect approaching storms and acts as a backup for navigation. Unlike your chartplotter which infers your position on a chart, radar shows you what is actually out there. We are a resource to our members who might need some help or coaching with their equipment. We can come aboard and show you how to use your equipment. Just ask!


