

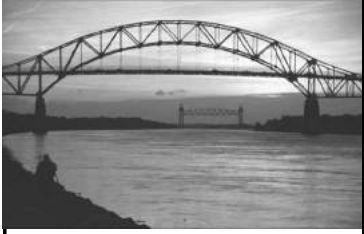

2024 SCHEDULE

America’s Boating Course (ABC) is recognized as one of the very best ways to prepare yourself for boating.

ABC meets NASBLA certification requirements, is recognized by the U.S. Coast Guard, and **meets MA requirements for boat operation by 12-15 year-old boaters.**

ABC covers the basics of operating a boat safely, including rules of the road, aids to navigation, required equipment, and boat handling techniques.

Each class is a live, interactive, virtual presentation using ZOOM on 4 weekday evenings followed by a “drive in” in-person, proctored exam given the Sunday morning following the last class.

Marine Navigation (P) & Advanced Marine Navigation (AP)

Marine Navigation and Advanced Marine Navigation are the United States Power Squadron’s courses providing you with skills needed to safely navigate coastal and inland waters.

Since most boaters use GPS, these courses provide you with what you need to successfully use GPS or a chartplotter to plan and navigate, as well as navigation software for planning using a computer. You’ll also learn how to check your navigation, and what to do if the GPS becomes faulty.

Public webcams installed on Little Brewster Island

/ Published Nov. 7, 2023

Boston – Four new webcams have been installed on Little Brewster Island, offering free panoramic real-time views from Boston Lighthouse of the island and surrounding areas.

The cameras enhance maritime safety by providing a picture of real-time sea conditions and visibility at the outer reaches of the harbor, allowing mariners to make informed decisions about their trip prior to leaving the dock.

"We identified a need to place a camera system on the Boston Lighthouse, providing operational safety and security awareness for the Sector," said Petty Officer 2nd Class John Northup, Coast Guard Sector Boston Waterways Management. "We also wanted to provide the public with access as well, granting them the ability to view the outer harbor before they depart on their voyages. The camera system gives the public a first-person view from the oldest lighthouse in America, something you usually don't see every day, but now you can!"

The webcam's installation is the result of cooperative efforts between the U.S. National Park Service, Hull Life-saving Museum, U.S. Coast Guard Sector Boston and Aids-to-Navigation Team Boston.

Originally built in 1716, Boston Light is the nation's oldest lighthouse station. It became a National Historic Landmark in 1964, and is still an active aid-to-navigation that casts a 27-mile light beam through a second-order revolving Fresnel lens that was installed in 1859.

Helping Fellow Boaters with Boat Handling Skills

The most popular topic for boating seminars is boat handling. A senior executive from a major boat building company once told me that their business was suffering from customers' discomfort with handling their boats. Their customer base had migrated to older individuals who did not grow up on boats. This demographic decided to buy a boat when they could finance it and had time to use it. Lack of on-water experience was the issue. As a result, these people did not move up to buy successively larger boats, but dropped out of boating. Moreover, their friends who might be likely to buy boats did not. He implored me to work toward a solution as it directly affected their business.

It was about that time that we recognized that USPS had no on-water and boat handling programs mainly due to the concern over liability. We managed to find how other organizations were able to do it, while we did not. The issue was insurance. Then we adopted the same insurance approach that they were using.

From the Coast Guard perspective, they feel that the basic boating courses have helped, but more is needed. That is why we succeeded in getting substantial grants to train people on boat handling. That is the critical next step in safer boating. Our approach was somewhat unique with a solid base of pre-training via seminars.

Boat handling has become a mainstream part of the USPS educational program. That said, the actual implementation has been spotty. Very few squadrons are offering on-water training of any sort. The Jump Start program is a way for every member to participate. The main theme of this program is helping the owner on his or her own boat.

However, you can help boating, and your squadron, by inviting folks to join you on your boat out on the water. You can explain how to handle the boat and encourage them to attend our seminars. We go beyond the basic USPS programs in explaining how to handle boats as they are different from handling cars. Start by joining us for the seminars. That will help you to explain boat handling to your friends and acquaintances. You'll also pick up some tips as well.

The perspective from the water is quite different from that on land. Help grow boating and build new friendships by helping them become fellow boaters.

Stay safe, stay warm as winter begins, and consider taking some of our seminars.
