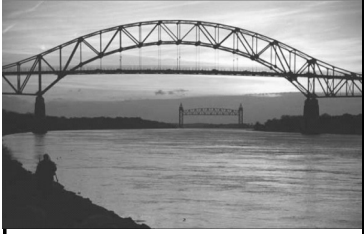

America’s Boating Course (ABC) is recognized as one of the very best ways to prepare yourself for boating.

ABC meets NASBLA certification requirements, is recognized by the U.S. Coast Guard, and **meets MA requirements for boat operation by 12-15 year-old boaters.**

ABC covers the basics of operating a boat safely, including rules of the road, aids to navigation, required equipment, and boat handling techniques.

Each class is a live, interactive, virtual presentation using ZOOM on 4 weekday evenings followed by a “drive in” in-person, proctored exam given the Sunday morning following the last class.

2024 SCHEDULE

- ***Do you fear docking your boat?***
- ***Do you think it is much easier to parallel park a car than dock a boat?***
- ***Do you have trouble leaving a dock with wind pushing you?***
- ***Is it a mystery why your boat behaves like it does?***

We have organized boat operator training into a two-part program:

- Part 1 Boat Handling - Close quarters maneuvering & docking / undocking. On water training uses a training boat in Red Brook Harbor and off Barlow’s Landing Pocasset. Typically, two students with an instructor.
- Part 2 Boat Handling - Review of part 1, use of twin engines, trim tabs, bow thrusters, planing speeds and operation on open waters with waves wind and currents. On water training uses your boat at it’s docking location / area. One student with an instructor.

Each part is comprised of two sections:

Pre-training Seminar

2-3 hour live, virtual, interactive classroom seminar and discussion session presented using Zoom with two instructors designed to prepare the students for the following on water training.

On Water Training

This a 3–3 ½ hour hands-on, on-water training where the student practices a sequential set of exercises all multiple times and works on their areas of concern.

On-Water Training Requirements:

1. Completion of pre-training seminar.
2. Completion of a NASBLA-approved basic boating course.
3. (Part 2 only) student’s boat must have a USPS/USCGA Vessel Safety Check prior to the training session.

In April, we offered our first sessions of the **Boat Handling Seminar** which explains how boats behave in response to your controls, thus making handling a snap. We like to say that docking a boat is really easier than parallel parking a car. You just need to know how. The next sessions begin in May and another in June. On water training is optionally available by Dick Moore on his boat, or by a number of us on your boat.

Hopefully, you are ready for a great boating season.

Navigation has Changed

Like most things in our life, everything seems to be involved with phones, tablets and computers. So too has navigation. While it is still essential to understand how to plan and navigate using paper charts, the new tools are helpful and, at the same time, frustrating.

Enter WiFi. Hard wiring between your chartplotter and your phone, tablet, or computer is not commonplace. But, adding WiFi to the chartplotter adds a new dimension. This enables you to interact with your chartplotter. It is not convenient to take your chartplotter off the boat, but using your phone or tablet, you have the means to work on your charts and plans from anywhere.

Garmin acquired ActiveCaptain, a crowd-sourced on-line resource which collected all sorts of useful information from its members. They then added WiFi to their chartplotters and enabled ActiveCaptain to become the portal between the chartplotter and a host of resources. More recently, Garmin acquired Navionics, one of the two major digital chart providers. While Garmin had developed their G3 charts prior to the Navionics acquisition, they have merged the G3 charts with updates using the Navionics data. Also, Navionics offers an online app. For a nominal annual subscription fee, you get access to a host of regularly updated charts including bathymetrics (detailed underwater profiles). You can plan on your tablet or phone and transfer your results to your chartplotter, or take your tracks, waypoints, and routes from your chartplotter and view them on your phone.

Using Active Captain, you can access crowd-sourced depth data in great detail and present it on your chartplotter. This is especially useful for transiting shallow bays and passageways, and for finding those great fishing spots. And, you too, can become a crowd-source contributor, providing the output of your sounder to the app.

There are a couple of problems with all of this. First, while on the water, you need to have navigation be as simple as possible because you have lots of other duties to perform and should not have your head in the chartplotter. And, second, the chartplotter is but a small window to your navigation.

You really also need paper charts nearby to provide the bigger picture, and serve as backup when the electronics misbehave – they will. Alas, today, it has become a challenge to get paper charts. The whole world has gone electronic, driven in-part by the government. Try to buy a chart. About the only resources still around are Maptech with chartbooks, and OceanGrafix with printed charts. Most of the other former chart providers offer to print charts you create using the NOAA Custom Chart app (NCC) online. To do that, you need to become the cartographer. Using NCC, you can create your own charts in pdf format which almost any wide-format capable printer can print. That means going to a commercial resource and pay them to print it. By the way, NCC is useful, but still a work in progress that produces a product far short of the now obsolete paper charts it replaces.

All of these changes tend to frustrate the traditional boater who is not as tech-savvy as their children or grandchildren. We just concluded our first session of the new USPS Marine Navigation course which was intended to replace Piloting. It instructs the use of OpenCPN which is a computer-based navigation tool. Unfortunately, this becomes a major hurdle and obfuscates the real need to learn navigation until you can master the software. This push to computerization has met negative feedback to the extent that the original Piloting Course, which was slated to be replaced, has been continued by popular demand.

The real utility of these new tools lies in the convenience to work on your navigation in the comfort of your home, or in the cabin after a day's cruise. Most folks do not take their chartplotter from the boat, so the ability to have access to and work with its navigation information provides an added measure of safety and confidence.

Above, I highlighted Garmin. If you have a Raymarine, or Simrad, or Furuno chartplotter, there are similar tools available. Clearly, the easy way to interact with your ship's electronics is with your phone or tablet. If you are not yet ready to take the time and energy to explore that, you can still use physical electronic chips to transfer information to/from your chartplotter using GPX files.

My advice to navigators is, stick to your guns, make sure you have printed charts on board and know how to use them. The electronics are great, but they will go awry or mis-behave. You need to have an immediate solution to work around them.

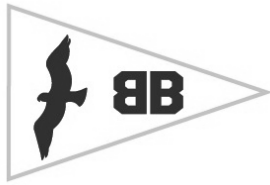

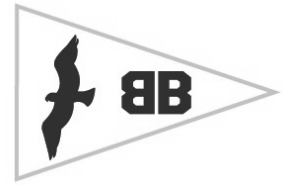
